REFERENCE MATERIALS

Critical Survey of Drama

Individual author essays contain brief biographical information; list of works; analysis of themes and techniques; critical interpretation of the playwright's works; and resource list for further study. Volumes 7-8 contain several essays covering dramatic genres; the forms of drama throughout history; ethnic/regional drama; and musical, experimental, and radio and television drama, as well as a comprehensive subject index. Arranged alphabetically by author's last name. *Some material available online in Literary Reference Center.*

Masterplots II: Drama Series

Contains brief critical evaluations of selected works of 20th-century drama. Most are English-language works, but representative plays in translation from European countries are also included. Arranged alphabetically by title of play. Each article includes time and place of the work's first performance, setting, principal characters, an overview of the action and plot, themes and meanings, and dramatic devices. Cumulative author and title indexes can be found in Volume 4. *Some material available online in Literary Reference Center.*

Drama for Students

In-depth analyses of classic examples of drama. Each entry includes an introduction to the play and the author, a plot summary, descriptions of important characters, analysis of important themes in the drama, an explanation of important literary techniques in the play, a critical overview, excerpts from published critical essays, and an essay placing the drama within its historical context. The most recent volume contains a cumulative author/title index. *Some material available online in Literature Resources from Gale.*

The Gale Series of Literary Criticism

This series provides excerpts from published literary criticism. Each set focuses on a particular genre or period of literature. A paperback cumulative title index is filed with each set. *Some material from each set is available online in Literature Resources from Gale.*

Includes authors writing between 1400 and 1800.

Includes authors writing between 1800 and 1900.

RESEARCHING THE TOPIC: Books

To locate books at PJC and other Florida community college libraries, click on [Find Books](#) at the top of the library homepage. Enter the author's last name into the search box along with the term *criticism*. Example: *miller criticism*. For criticism of a particular work, enter title along with *criticism*. Example: *crucible criticism*. Books can be requested from other campuses. ARTICLES

Click on the [Find Articles](#) link at the top of the library home page for a list of most used article databases by subject. Login is required once a database is selected. Login is automatic from the library computers. **To log in from remote computers:** 1) select Pensacola Junior college from the drop down menu; 2) type the 14-digit barcode number from the PJC ID card in the Borrower ID box; 3) type the last four digits of your Social Security number into the PIN box.

[Literature Resources from Gale](#)

Single search access to biographical and critical information on authors and their works pulled from a variety of literary reference sources and current journal articles. Covers authors from every age and literary discipline. To limit to **full-text** articles only, and or peer-reviewed publications, check the appropriate box(es).

[Literary Reference Center \(EBSCO\)](#)

Contains the full text of plot summaries, synopses and work overviews, articles from literary journals, author biographies, over 11,000 classic and contemporary short stories, and author interviews and images of key literary figures.

[JSTOR](#)

Access back issues of core journals in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences. Over 700 titles available. *Use the Advanced Search*, page down to select the Discipline *Language & Literature*.

[Academic Search Complete \(EBSCO\)](#)

Multidisciplinary source of articles from magazines and scholarly (peer-reviewed) journals. Includes abstracts (summaries) of most articles. To limit to **full-text** articles only, and/or scholarly (peer-reviewed) journals, check the appropriate box(es). *Advanced Search* provides a guided method for combining keywords.

[General OneFile \(Gale\)](#)

Multidisciplinary source of articles from a variety of reference sources including magazines, academic journals and newswires. To limit to **full-text** articles only, and/or peer-reviewed publications, check the appropriate box(es).
